iLife '05 seems to be all about the power. With iPhoto, Apple gives its customers the ability to control several different aspects of an image, including contrast, saturation, brightness, and exposure, as well as offering color adjustment and basic cropping and editing tools.

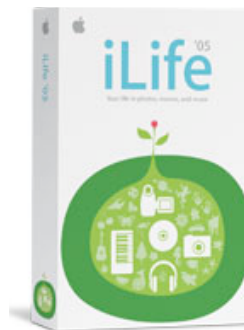
With iMovie, users get the entirely new experience of being able to edit HD video right in the simple interface that it incorporates.

In GarageBand, Apple has added quite a few new power features, including the ability to edit the pan of a track instead of just the volume, the option of recording up to eight audio tracks simultaneously.

The updates to iDVD and iTunes are less prominent, but still evident.

They include new templates for DVD

menus, and support for the iPod shuffle. All in all, iLife '05 is a must-have for any Mac user.
